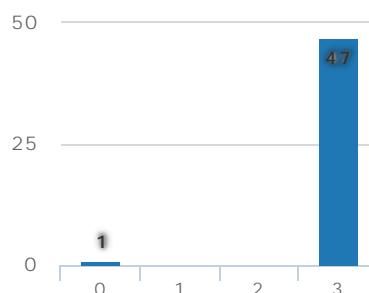

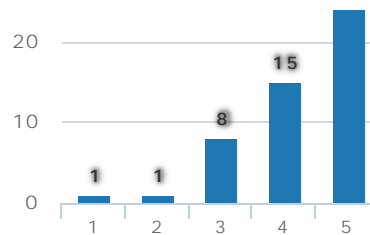

- I wasn't expecting as much statistics which was a bit discouraging but the professor clearly knew the material and did her best to explain the advanced concepts.
- Lecture can be a little bit dry and boring. The powerpoints get too bogged down in mathematics.
- I think this may be the most interesting economics course I have taken at UW. I like that it is different and has very applicable content, meaning, etc.
- The power point of this lecture really contains all knowledge points needed in the lecture. And can help me to review the materials in home.
- The homework and the discussion.
- Prof Wilson did a nice job, topic can be dry at times but she did her best.
- Professor Andrea is very helpful and always show her willingness to help her students. The only drawback is that she tends to go over material too fast and sometimes can be quite confusing. The materials are very engaging and match the real life scenarios pretty well.
- Just an awkward stage presence. Constant lack of confidence really distracts from learning. I enjoy the example and the number of example is perfect in nailing the topic; however, she read off the slides which makes the class slow and drag. She cares for her students but lacks the ability to present material efficiently.
- Would have liked some discussion on commonly missed questions on exams
- I thought that the professor was very good at responding to emails in a timely manner, so that is a plus. The lectures rarely captured my attention though.

I also noticed a lot of spelling errors within the lecture notes. There was at least one error per set of slides on some very simple things. It's not a huge deal, but I expect my professors to be a bit more careful and neat when presenting lecture notes.

- ANDREA you're amazing. I'm pretty sure you're not going to be here in the fall but I wish you the best of everything wherever you'll be. I really enjoyed your class. Your lectures are very clear and you do a good job of asking if anyone is lost or has questions. Organization is good, I like being able to print the lecture slides off before class and annotate them.
- Great professor, very knowledgeable, knows the right level at which to present the material to undergrads. The last third of the course I thought became a bit scattered, with a ton of different models that didn't really relate to or build upon each other as far as I could tell. Maybe paring it down to two or at most, three models in the last portion of the course would help with understanding
- Pace of course was too slow.
- Professor is generally excellent at teaching. Random unrelated note though: She tries often to spice things up with random activities/stories/experiments etc. This is a great idea, but she often seems to lack confidence and gets easily flustered while doing them. It can get awkward at times, especially when the point she is trying to make is very obvious. The "Experiments" she runs to test behavioral theories simply don't work well on the class when the class is explained beforehand what behavior is being tested. Another professor of mine did a similar thing more effectively. She passed out a "quiz" of sorts used to test certain behavioral quirks (anchoring effect, bounded rationality, etc.) on the first day. Then as we went through the unit, she would refer back to the quiz and reference the results of each question to illustrate the point. ... but this is just a minor complaint. Professor is excellent otherwise.
- Awesome professor, awesome subject matter. overall awesome class
- The lectures would be benefitted from the professor having some kind of clicker for her slides. It is sometimes distracting to see her moving from the computer to in front of the screen. She is very understanding and always invites the class to have questions.
- Behavioral economics is a very tough subject. It gets incredibly math-y (Bayesian-y?), but professor Wilson does an excellent job of using the math to show big picture, general results. One of the most thought provoking classes I have ever had, and as an Econ major it is very refreshing to take a class that deals with real life situations instead of constant theory. 10/10 would recommend both class and professor
- Absolutely phenomenal professor!!! -Very clear explanations of course material -the problem sets were very straight-forward & doable -the review sheets were super helpful in studying for the exams -I really liked how the class was structured more around the process of learning the material instead of just memorization - it changed the flavor of the course content (focusing it more on the joy of exploring new concepts/models/ideas) & made taking exams, completing problem sets, etc... a whole lot less stressful -So, I originally decided to enroll in this class, not because I needed to meet a specific requirement for the major (I already had them all squared away), but because I had an open spot in my schedule this spring & it sounded like an interesting course to take. And in retrospect, I'm so glad that I hit that enrollment button - Behavioral economics has been such an enjoyable, interesting course. I've absolutely loved the blend of econ + psych + soc, and I think it's actually something that I'd want to pursue later down the way in grad studies. Thanks so much! :)
